

A Message from the Executive Director

It is with great pleasure and a humble heart that I present to you the first UCE annual report. It is hard to believe that only 8 years ago UCE began with the simple idea that God has shown us how to live healthy lives. In His omnipotent design, He gave us the tools we need to defeat the scourge of HIV/AIDS and overcome the sorrows of a broken family. Eight years ago UCE was just a dream. A dream of helping people help themselves. A dream to allow Africans to teach God's message the way they know how to teach it. A dream to renew faith, instill passion, and help people live healthy lives. To date, 116,235 lives have been forever changed by this simple message.

In the Fiscal Year August 1st 2010 through July 31st 2011, we visited 172 high schools, 10 teacher training colleges, 6 vocational schools, 5 seminaries, and held 6 seminars in Uganda, Burundi, and Tanzania. 37,725 students made new commitments to abstain until a faithful marriage. Additionally, we established 18 new UCE clubs at previously visited schools to help students maintain their choice. UCE clubs, pioneered in Tanzania, are giving young people strength in their decisions. They give students an outlet to talk about everyday challenges in a comfortable environment with like-minded people. The clubs have been a big success, and we have plans to continue the program next year.

We also took to the airwaves and print media last year. In Burundi, Bishop Martin Nyaboho hosted 104 radio talk shows that were heard by an estimated 200,000 people. In Uganda, Fr. Walter Munna and Walubo Jude began monthly radio shows in the Kasese district. In Tanzania, Isaac Lema, published the first UCE book in Swahili, *Sex Before, Within, and Outside of Marriage*. In the United States, Dr. Kim Dernovsek authored a chapter in the medical textbook, *Preventative Dermatology*, entitled "Prevention of Sexually Transmitted Diseases from Office to Globe."


On the heels of our summer Backyard Braai, we increased our donor base and overall financial support. Additionally, we increased program efficiency and financial transparency. 87% of expenses were spent of program services, as opposed to 83% the preceding year, 12% were spent on general expenses and management, and 1% were spent on fundraising.

It is an exciting time for UCE. We are growing and reaching more and more people as God continues to open new doors for the ministry. We hope that in the coming year you will join us again in the support of an African dream, the dream of faith, hope, and health. You are most welcome here!

The mission of UCE is To promote, through Christian principles, abstinence and faithful marriage as the healthiest way of life.

It is estimated that 33 million people suffer from HIV/AIDS. Of these 22 million live in sub-Saharan Africa. The most common way HIV is spread is through sexual intercourse. There is no cure for AIDS, and over 25 million people have died of the disease since 1981. UCE promotes an effective method of HIV/AIDS prevention that has been proven to reduce the spread of HIV/AIDS and save lives.

UCE is completely funded by private donors. Without donations, UCE would not be able to support the fight against HIV/AIDS. Hope is restored and lives are saved daily as a result of the UCE message. Through UCE, the powerful biblical principle of chastity is shared with young adults around the world so that they may experience God's love and generosity in forgiveness, and learn of his perfect plan for them.



Abstinence is the only method of HIV/AIDS prevention that gives a person 100% protection. UCE promotes abstinence not only as the best means of HIV/AIDS prevention for a young person, but also as an all around healthy lifestyle. UCE sees the importance of students staying in school, and staying healthy so that they may become successful members of their communities.






Program Services Expenditure by Country

MESSAGE FROM HIS EMINENCE EMMANUEL CARDINAL WAMALA

Dear friends and partners of Universal Chastity Education,

Greetings in Jesus Christ's Name! I congratulate UCE upon the great work done in 2011 of reaching out to the youth with the life saving and inexpensive Godly message of Chastity. I thank God for the vision of the UCE founders; Dr. Kim and Kenneth Dernovsek, and for the strength, passion and commitment of Andrew the Executive Director and all the UCE teams in Uganda and around the world.

The number of orphans, and children born with AIDS has been growing just as the infection rate among married couples who are not faithful. The Church knows very well the real impact of HIV and of AIDS upon her sons and daughters, and it will be so for decades to come if we don't reach everyone with this message of chastity.

It is so expensive to treat AIDS and condom use is both immoral and ineffective. Condoms promote promiscuity and I commend UCE for mobilizing youths to wait to have sex until marriage as the correct option.

At a time when official concerns about the pandemic are retreating, I commend UCE for the determination to keep on as a team providing fitting responses. Our continent is still the worst afflicted yet we have meager resources. HIV/AIDS is not just a medical problem and investing in pharmaceuticals alone will not work. AIDS cannot be overcome by relying primarily on the distribution of condoms. The UCE strategy based on education to individual responsibility in the framework of a moral view of human sexuality, especially through abstinence and fidelity, can have a real impact on the prevention of this disease.

The Church's understanding of marriage as the total, reciprocal and exclusive communion of love between a man and a woman prompts the most effective behaviors for preventing the sexual transmission of disease: namely, abstinence before marriage and fidelity within marriage.

I thank UCE for preparing youths to be today's and tomorrow's salt of the earth and light of the world, active, generous and responsible members of society. I firmly believe in the youth and let no one deceive them into thinking that they cannot control themselves.



UGANDA



The Uganda country program holds outreaches, seminars, and establishes UCE abstinence clubs to prevent HIV/AIDS, restore hope to young people, and help people live healthy lives.



The teams also use other communication mediums such as radio shows to disseminate the UCE message. Here a volunteer talks about chastity while the commentator looks on.

"It is a privilege to go into our schools especially in the rural areas. I get to see firsthand what God is doing through the UCE ministry. Every time we head out to visit a school we feel a great sense of expectancy for what God is going to do. For me, the opportunity to lead a young person to a Godly and risk free lifestyle is a humbling one. In almost every meeting, half of those attending make a commitment to abstain from sex until marriage."

Education comes full circle: Christine grew up in a humble setting. She was poor and her family lacked many things including the money to pay for her schooling. Still, she desired to better herself, and wanted to attend school. Men in her village offered to pay for her school fees in exchange for sex. However, she heard a UCE message and refused to be taken advantage of. She worked hard and found other ways to pay her school fees, even delaying her education. She says that the hard work helped her to remain focused on her studies, and that today she can buy many of the good things she wanted earlier in life and is free of STDs. Many of her friends were forced to drop out of school due to pregnancy or passed away from HIV/AIDS. She says that her only hope is in Jesus Christ, and she now volunteers with UCE to share her story with others.

BURUNDI

God is doing great things in the Burundi country program. UCE-Burundi continues to innovate new and impressive ways to spread the UCE message. This year, they had weekly interactive radio shows, youth soccer games, an abstinence march, and traditional outreaches.

One of UCE-Burundi's first students in 2006 came back to the staff this year to share her story and thank them for the life giving message.



"My name is Rukundo Trinita and I am 24 years old. I had enrolled at Gatwenzi Boarding High School after my primary school education where I stayed with 646 students both boys and girls. Fornication or sexual intercourse were practiced by some of the students.

I kept searching how I could escape or prevent myself from such a misbehavior until I attended a UCE Seminar in Makamba in 2006. We were taught that there are over 21 sexually transmitted disease including HIV/AIDS and we discovered that there are many factors which draw the youth to sexuality. During the seminar my life changed when I decided to abstain until my wedding day. My faith was strengthened when UCE-Burundi sponsored some of us to attend Bugolobi youth conference in Kampala, Uganda in 2007. I'm now a University student in Bujumbura at Hope University and I'm committed to share with other students the true teachings of Universal Chastity Education. Lives are being changed."

The UCE message is for everyone! Youth and couples alike are hurt by leading lives that are not in the scope of God's perfect plan for us....

Mr. and Mrs. Ntandikiye, know first hand of the pain of a marriage without fidelity:
 "I've lived a miserable life with my husband since 2004 until I had planned to commit suicide. My aunt Sofia, who had attended a couple's UCE seminar, arranged my attendance to one of the seminars. My husband agreed to join too. After the seminar, things have changed in many ways: we have together to a voluntary HIV/AIDS test, we've signed the Be Faithful cards we've legalized our wedding in the church, and we've committed our lives to Jesus Christ. Since 2010 we are living a happy and well organized life."

TANZANIA

UCE programs in Tanzania are divided into three phases. In phase one, the team goes on outreach to secondary schools or colleges. The purpose of this phase is to create awareness, share information, and change the attitudes of the youth so that they will understand the importance of abstaining.



Depending on the size of the school, anywhere from a few hundred to several thousand students can be present at an outreach. This year the team had 36 outreaches.

In phase two, students who have previously signed abstinence cards are invited to attend a day-long event. The purpose of this phase is to cement the message by sharing information, building skills, encouraging youth, and training peer educators.



This year the team held 2 large seminars for youth committed to the UCE message.

TANZANIA

In phase three, UCE establishes clubs at schools. The purpose of the clubs is to give students a daily support base among their peers. Additionally, the clubs aim to build abstinence skills and self esteem, and give spiritual and moral support to the youth.



Eventually, club leaders assist in spreading the message to their peers. Here, Herman , a club leader, talks to students from his school about abstinence until a faithful marriage while the UCE team looks on. This year 6 clubs were formed.

Valentine, from Ilole Secondary School, said that since she has made a decision and signed an abstinence card she has receiving good compliments from her family and friends about her current behavior. The club has also helped her to have better friends from both genders and become a responsible adult.




On his wedding day, November 20, 2010, with his bride at his side, Ugandan Dickson Tumuramye asked to tell the world about what UCE has done.

Abstinence 100% perfect!"
