MESSAGE FROM THE DIRECTOR

As we descended from the UCE team's mountain home of Makamba, Burundi to the lowlands of the neighboring district of Nyanza-Lac the temperature increased, and the air grew muggy and oppressive. We drove through the huge community built around fishing, and the mood of the people matched the stifling heaviness of the air. It seemed a place where hope was in short supply. When we arrived at the school, the students told us of pressures to leave school and either fish or exchange sex for money. Living with these challenges of extreme poverty, the youth saw no value in their lives.

With light shining off their faces and truth coming from their lips, the UCE Burundi team brought a message that none had ever heard. They brought a message of hope, love, and new life in Christ. They explained how abstinence until faithful marriage was the certain way to prevent HIV/AIDS and sexually transmitted diseases. I watched, during the 3 hours, as the faces of the teens in front of me slowly transformed from morose and downtrodden to jubilant and free. When the outreach began to conclude, the team could hardly contain the students as they rushed forward to make commitments. 256 boys and 198 girls gave their lives to Christ and committed to chastity that day. As the team left the school, the students' emotions erupted in tears, cries of joy, and shouts of thanks. The photo of that moment adorns the cover of this year's annual report. It is a picture of pure joy, love, and the newness of life that only the Spirit can bring.

The evening after the outreach, the team was contacted by the Muslim headmaster of the nearby Nyanza-Lac Islamic School. He had heard about the day's events, and wanted an outreach, which the team arranged for the very next day. The team put on the full armor of God, traveled back to Nyanza-Lac, and reached the Islamic school. After the outreach the headmaster said, "It is my wish that the UCE program should be included in the curriculum of our education system. I compliment the UCE team and recommend that you should be coming often to visit not only this Islamic school but also many more because as some of the students dared to say, this UCE program is very new for many of us." There is no power like that of the great I AM.

In the Fiscal Year ending July 31st 2013, UCE visited 133 high schools, 3 teacher training colleges, 1 vocational school, 4 universities, and held 1 chastity rally, 3 seminars, and 10 conferences in Uganda, Burundi, and Tanzania. 39,494 youths made commitments to abstain until a faithful marriage. UCE established 57 new UCE Chastity Clubs. The UCE Prayer Warriors program was launched, and people from across the globe, of many different denominations, have joined our teams in prayer.

To date, 237,730 young people have committed themselves to God and chastity. At our fourth annual summer Backyard Braai, a record number of donors stepped forward in faith to sponsor a school outreach at \$250 each. This year, 88% of expenses were spent on program services, 9% were spent on general expenses and management, and 3% were spent on fundraising. God continues to guide UCE, and bless the ministry. Thank you to all of you who helped UCE to bring this life-saving message to people so far away. I hope the following report on our yearly activities will bring you great joy.

HELPING PEOPLE LIVE HEALTHY LIVES


The mission of UCE is to promote, through Christian principles, abstinence and faithful marriage as the healthiest way of life.

It is estimated that 35 million people suffer from HIV/AIDS. Of these 25 million live in sub-Saharan Africa. The most common way HIV is spread is through sexual intercourse. There is no cure for AIDS, and over 25 million people have died of the disease since 1981. UCE promotes an effective method of HIV/AIDS prevention that has been proven to reduce the spread of HIV/AIDS and save lives.

UCE is completely funded by private donors. Without donations, UCE would not be able to support the fight against HIV/AIDS. Hope is restored and lives are saved daily as a result of the UCE message. Through UCE, the powerful biblical principle of chastity is shared with young adults around the world so that they may experience God's love and generosity in forgiveness, and learn of his perfect plan for them.

Chastity is the only method of HIV/AIDS prevention that gives a person 100% protection. UCE promotes chastity not only as the best means of HIV/AIDS prevention for a young person, but also as an all-around healthy lifestyle. UCE sees the importance of students staying in school, and staying healthy so that they may become successful members of their communities.

Outreaches were the main program activity with teams both in Mbale and Kasese reaching out to youths with the message of chastity. 10,777 commitments were made to Christ and chastity this year. Countless others were reached by radio messages, seminars, conferences, and through the UCE Clubs.

UCE received a donation of 500 Bibles from The Gideons International. These Bibles were distributed to youths in secondary schools both in Mbale, eastern Uganda, and in Kasese, western Uganda.

CHASTITY SUNDAY

The Ugandan Joint Christian Council (UJCC), which represents the Anglican, Catholic, and Orthodox churches, and over 80% of all Ugandans, endorsed and accepted an UCE proposal to hold an annual Sunday when clergy throughout Uganda would speak from the pulpit on chastity. The UJCC passed a resolution declaring October 7th, 2012 as the first annual Chastity Sunday. Millions of Ugandans heard the message of chastity that Sunday as the clergy joined with UCE to form a united front in the teaching of chastity. The Uganda Joint Christian Council members also set October 6th, 2013 as the second Chastity Sunday.

UCE MANUAL DISTRIBUTION

We continued distributing copies of the UCE manual, which answers the most commonly asked questions we receive on outreach. The manual addresses issues such as: chastity, virginity, teenage pregnancy, HIV/AIDS, masturbation, rape, STDs, female and male reproductive health, pornography, relationships and marriage, faith, personal growth, and education. It also gives youth a guide to initiating a personal relationship with Jesus Christ. UCE has distributed 1,400 copies of the UCE Manual to secondary schools in Uganda. We have received feedback from the students and clubs that they love it, and that it is most read book in their school library.

LAUNCH OF THE UCE CHASTITY CLUB SPORTS PROGRAM

One of the key highlights of 2012/2013 was the launch of an innovative UCE Chastity Club Sports Program. The UCE sports program was launched in Kasese, in February 2013. The program has created an environment where students who have committed their lives to chastity and Christ can come together in a healthy, safe, environment and be encouraged by one another. In addition to sports for both boys and girls, the clubs have drama, debate, dance, crafts, chastity and faith lessons. The clubs build self-esteem, life skills, teamwork, discipline, character, and help the youth develop healthy relationships, ultimately preparing them to be successful and prosperous in the next phase of their lives. Eight UCE Chastity clubs, with a sports program, have been formed. "HIV/AIDS still claims many lives in the poor country of Burundi. We are determined to intervene in uprooting its causes by providing chastity education for the youths, adults, parents, and teachers in order to help people of our community to live healthy lives. Let us be reminded of Christ's compassion to the weary and scattered people in Matthew 9:

'Jesus went through all the towns and villages, teaching in their synagogues, proclaiming the good news of the kingdom and healing every disease and sickness. When he saw the crowds, he had compassion on them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field."'

The UCE – Burundi team has been preaching the Gospel among the people of Burundi. But when we see the multitudes of people dying with HIV/AIDS, we are moved with compassion for the present generation who have been ignored and not taught proper prevention for this killing disease: abstinence and faithfulness. This year, UCE Burundi reached over 17,000 students and 345 married persons. 13,608 youths made a pledge of chastity and 311 married persons signed faithfulness cards. The Burundi team aims to help the youth 'cross over' adolescence in a healthy way, while keeping their focus on Christ.

This year, UCE Club members joined him. The students, who have an array of wonderful talents, prepared poems, songs, and skits that talk about the importance of abstaining until a faithful marriage. The shows have been a big hit, and the students received wonderful feedback from their peers and parents alike.

UCE TANZANIA CARRIES OUT THEIR MINISTRY IN 3 PHASES

ANNAN

In phase 1, the team reaches out to secondary schools and colleges. The teams travel to schools to give a message of chastity and hope. They go with the attitude that they have 2-3 hours to give the students the most important message they will ever hear. This may be the only chance they have to reach these students, and they offer students the opportunity to commit their lives to God and to chastity. This year they had 69 outreaches, and reached approximately 22,000 youth.

In phase 2, the team holds seminars specifically for those who have signed chastity commitment cards. They are multi-school events where the youth gather to be strengthened in the choice they have made. The purpose of this phase is to continue to share more in-depth information on how students can protect themselves, build their life skills, train peer educators, and give them tools to succeed. This year the team had 2 seminars.

In phase 3, UCE clubs are formed. The purpose of this phase is to help the young people cement themselves in the decision they have made while preparing them for the challenges of life, and college. In this phase, the team provides counseling, psychological, spiritual, and moral support. They also work to build students' self-esteem, life skills, and create a healthy, positive after-school environment for the students. UCE Tanzania has 12 clubs, with over 1,000 members.



This year, on Tumaini Radio in Dar Es Salaam, the UCE message hit the airwaves for the first time in Tanzania. The topic was "Following Christianity's Guidelines in Relationships among the Youth." The team held 4 one-hour long radio sessions.

IT BEGINS WITH ME

Chastity brought me respect, responsibility, and has helped me to concentrate on my studies. In fact, it is why I have been so successful at school. Chastity has transformed my heart, and I desire to reach society and teach other people what I have learned.

On November 11th, 2009 the Universal Chastity Education team visited my school, Mlamke Secondary School. After the seminar, I was so taken by the message the team brought that I immediately signed a chastity card. Afterwards, I began to think about how I could get more information about what the team had talked about, and also give that information to others.

I chose to accept the message of chastity for several reasons. The human body comprises many things, including a heart. If that heart is harmed emotionally, then love disappears in society. I knew that chastity was the only way that I could guarantee a healthy life, respect, harmony, and protection. I also knew that it expresses responsibility, humanity, and consideration in each and every thing that I do each day. I accepted the message of chastity, and this made me a leader among my fellow youth. They would come to me and ask for advice whenever they faced challenges. My parents were very proud of me.

The next year I transferred to Njombe Secondary School, and I asked the team to visit my school. After the outreach, we officially opened a UCE Club at Njombe, and I was selected to lead the club. The team continued to send me topics and information so that I could teach the other students in the club. I gained additional information and experience by using my holidays to travel with the UCE team to conduct outreaches in other schools. I volunteered with UCE because I wanted to gain more knowledge about how to help youth protect themselves from HIV, teenage pregnancies, and also gain the respect of their peers.

After I graduated from high school, I had done well and so was able to attend university. I was accepted into Sokoine University of Agriculture, Morogoro Tanzania. I am earning a Bachelor of Science degree in Irrigation & Water Resource Engineering. I have found that the lifestyle at university is contra to that of my high school. At university, students are less guided by laws and regulation. They have more freedom to do what they want. When I arrived at University in October of 2012, I recognized this lifestyle may result in some students not completing their studies.

Surely, this was a challenge, as many were engaging in premarital sexual intercourse. Still, the challenge remained the same, how can I help them to learn about a better way of living? It was difficult, and I thought there would be no way! Then I had the idea that if I introduced the UCE message to a certain group, the

members of that group would be as ambassadors to help others, like happened in my high school. I thought, 'can I keep quiet until the school administration approves an UCE outreach? No!!' I decided I must start with Christian groups, then they will spread the message to others.

That's what I did, I asked for permission from Christian student leaders, and they allowed me to speak. I consulted with the UCE team, and they sent me documents, including books, and chastity cards. I have now been able to reach out to my peers, some of whom have joined me in reaching out to neighboring secondary schools.

As for my chastity card, I always walk with it in my pocket, since the day I signed it. Whenever I talk about the advantages of abstaining, there is always someone who says it is impossible. I take out my chastity card and show them my example. IT BEGINS WITH ME! Then I tell the youth that because of this chastity card, I have a good relationship with God, I am excelling in my studies, and I am respected in my community.
